

2022 FRENCH TOUR QUALIFYING SCHOOL FFGOLF – PGA FRANCE

1st Stage: 5th and 6th March 2022

Final Stage: from 9th to 11th March 2022

(For all stages: entries close Thursday 24th February 2022 @ 23h00)

PREAMBLE

The French Professional Commission (formed by representatives of the French Golf Federation and the French PGA) will organize the 2022 French Tour Qualifying School ffgolf – PGA France.

The Qualifying School will be opened to the foreign players filling the conditions of eligibility.

At the conclusion of the 2022 French Tour Qualifying School ffgolf – PGA France, the ranking will then allow to determine the categories member players of the 2022 French Tour.

REGULATIONS

1. FORMAT



The Qualifying School will be conducted in two stages of stroke play at the following venue:

FIRST STAGE

(36 holes) – 5th and 6th March 2022

The tournament is open to a maximum of **78** players (professionals and amateurs).

This is for all applicants **except** those who are exempt and qualified directly to the **Final Stage**.

Priority may be determined by the entry fee date of payment.

First Stage will be played on **Saturday 5th and Sunday 6th March**.

All applicants are advised that Monday 7th March may be used as a full playing day.

First Stage is scheduled to be played Stroke play over 36 holes.

Minimum 15 players will be qualified to the Final Stage. The number of players qualifying to proceed to the Final Stage will be announced after the start of the first round of First Stage.

In case of ties, a hole-by-hole playoff will determine the selected players. Playoff will take place as soon as possible after the end of regular play.

FINAL STAGE

(54 holes) – from 9th to 11th March 2022

The tournament is open to a maximum of **78** players (professionals and amateurs).

The following players are exempt from the First Stage and eligible for the Final Stage (**automatic exemptions**):

- a. Players finishing beyond 40th place of the French National Order of Merit on the 10th December 2021.
- b. Amateur players who took part in the 2021 Men or Boys European Team Championships.
- c. Players with the "1st series elite" status in 2022 in France.

Attention:

The French Professional Commission can spread out the criteria of exemption of the First Stage (**optional exemptions**), in the number of available spots:

- d. to players who have a category on the Challenge Tour for 2022 (from category 1 to 20).
- e. to players who have a category on the Alps Tour for 2022 (from category 0 to 9).
- f. Players who have a category on the Pro Golf Tour for 2021 (from category 1 to 10).
- g. to former winners of tournaments listed on the French Tour schedule.
- h. to players who had a category on the French Tour in 2021 or in 2022 (from category 1 to 40).

Final Stage will be played **from Wednesday 9th to Friday 11th March 2022**.

Players are advised that Saturday 12th March may be used as a full playing day.

Final Stage is scheduled to be played Stroke play over 54 holes.

After 36 holes, the field will be cut down to the leading **40** players and ties who will play the last round.

After 54 holes, players who make the cut and ties will be ranked according to their scores.

All tied scores shall be ranked by the best last 18 holes, 9, 6, 3, and last hole.

The final ranking will determine the member players of the following 2022 French Tour categories:

- **The winner of the French Tour Qualifying School:** Category 17 (access to all the sanctioned tournaments "Challenge Tour", "Alps Tour" and "French Tour" in France).
- **The leading 5 players of the French Tour Qualifying School:** Category 20 (access to minimum two sanctioned tournaments "Challenge Tour" in France and access to all the sanctioned tournaments "Alps Tour" and the "French Tour" in France).
- **The leading 20 players of the French Tour Qualifying School:** Category 25 (access to all the sanctioned tournaments "Alps Tour" and the "French Tour" in France).
- **Players making the cut of the French Tour Qualifying School and finishing beyond 20th place and ties of the Final Result:** Category 34 (reserve category).

Every effort will be made to complete three rounds, but a result shall be declared even if only two rounds are played.

If at least two rounds cannot be played, the Final Stage shall be partially or totally rescheduled.

2. ELIGIBILITY

- (1) All male professional players.
- (2) All male amateur players, with a handicap below or equal to 1.4 (handicap has to be certified by the National Golf organization for foreign players) at the closing date.
- (3) French players must have taken their ffgolf license for 2022 and provided a medical certificate before trying to register online.

3. PLAYING STANDARDS

Any Tournament Participant who records **a score of 90 or over** in the first round of a Tournament may be retired.

This regulation shall be implemented at the Tournament Director's discretion having taken into consideration prevailing weather conditions.

4. AMATEUR COMPETITORS

The Qualifying School is **not taken** for index management(both stages).

5. HEALTH PROTOCOL (until further notice)

MANDATORY

As golf courses are listed as establishments receiving some public (ERP), they must apply the French governate law about Covid-19 policy. For everyone aged 16 and older, only a fully vaccinated person owning a vaccination pass (also called "super green pass" in some foreign countries) will be allowed to enter to the golf course (competitor, caddie, accompanying person...).

What is a vaccination pass? How is it different from the Covid certificate?

In France, the COVID certificate has been replaced by a **vaccination pass** for everyone aged 16 and older.

A digital or paper version of one of the following may be provided as a vaccination pass:

- A vaccine certificate showing full vaccination,
- A certificate of recovery from COVID (from 11 days to 6 months prior),
- A certificate of medical reasons for not being vaccinated.

A competitor aged under 16 will have to show a COVID certificate.

All competitors, caddies and accompanying people will have **to show their vaccination pass to the tournament office** by using **#tousanticovid** app to be allowed to take part to the tournament or to caddy a player.

When you are on site:

- Wear a mask in all indoor AND outdoor areas (car park, driving range access and course access) except when you play golf.
- Wash hands frequently and follow all the health measures.
- Behave in a socially distanced manner at all times.

Everyone must bring his own masks and hand sanitizer.

6. DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES

Distance measuring devices won't be allowed during the tournament (allowed during practice rounds). A yardage book in meters is included into the entry fee.

7. ENTRY ONLINE / PAYMENT

All applicants: **317 Euros.**

This payment covers entry fee (290€) and yardage book (27€).

All entry registration and entry fee payment must be done and paid on:

8. ENTRY DEADLINE

Entries will close on **Thursday 24th February at 23h00 (11.00 PM).**

9. WITHDRAWALS

All withdrawals must be notified to the ffgolf.

If a player withdraws prior to the appropriate closing date his entry fee will be refunded in full.

If a player withdraws after the appropriate closing date, without competing, he will be refunded only **180 Euros.** (NB: No exceptions).

If a player is absent on the tee without notification, no refund will be given, and he may face disciplinary action subject to circumstances.

Once an entrant has teed off, refund of entry is not possible.

NOTE: refunds will not be issued until close of entries.

10. NOTIFICATION OF ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRY

Once an application has been accepted, applicants will be e-mailed a confirmation of entry.

The receipt of the payment of the entry fee will be available at the Tournament Office.

The final field of French Tour Qualifying School will be available on **Friday 25th February** on the official website (<http://ftr.ocs-sport.com/tic/tmtic.cgi>) and will be sent by e-mail.

The ffgolf is not responsible for your entry and **it is the applicant's responsibility to verify his status in the French Tour Qualifying School.**

11. GENERAL POLICY

The French Professional Commission reserves the right to change or amend the above format, conditions, and schedule of play and also to reject application for entry at any time.

Conduct unbecoming a professional or non-competitive performance in a previous Qualifying School can be a basis for the rejection of the application to enter by the French Professional Commission.

12. JOINING THE FRENCH TOUR

To obtain full membership rights, players who are eligible for membership in 2022 French Tour categories, must have paid their membership fee to PGA France and ffgolf license before the 31st March 2022.

Foreign players will not be included on the French National Order of Merit 2022. They will be eligible to join the French Tour in 2023 categories only by obtaining a category by French Tour Qualifying School 2023.
